Child Benefit can be paid for a child under the age of 16 or a young person up to the age of 20 if they are in full-time non-advanced education or approved training. Who should claim Child Benefit? You should fill in this claim form if you are responsible for a child.

### Child Benefit claim form - Revenue Benefits

Filling in the Child Benefit claim form also ensures that you are registered to receive National Insurance credits which can help to protect your State Pension. It is therefore really important to fill in the form if you have a new child in your family even if you do not wish to receive the Child Benefit payments.
