Each is also an implicit conversation with the poets who came before, or who are writing as we read. *A Stranger's Mirror* is not meant only for poets. These poems belong to anyone who has sought in language an expression and extension of his or her engagement with the world—far off or up close as the morning's first cup of tea.

The fourth volume in the popular series that began with *Ten Poems to Change Your Life*, *Ten Poems to Last a Lifetime* focuses on what it means to be truly human. In it, Roger Housden offers us poems on life and death, happiness, seeing ourselves in relation to the world, and, of course, the

ineffable—the things that really matter when the chips are down.
