Although its visions often seem bizarre to the Western reader, fortunately the book provides a number of clues for its own interpretation (e.g., stars are angels, lampstands are churches, 1:20 ; "the great prostitute," 17:1 , is "Babylon" [Rome?], 17:5,18 ; and the heavenly Jerusalem is the wife of the Lamb, 21:9-10).
